Birds of the Marsh (1hr 30min | 10-11:30am)

Encounter and learn about some of Marshy Point's frequent flyers' traits and adaptations during an observational hike through various habitats.

Custom Program (1hr | 10-11am)

Limited availability and at naturalist's discretion.

Pre-K & Kinder Nature (1hr | 10-11:00am)

Introduce little ones ages 3-5 years old to nature through natural artifact and animal ambassador encounters.

Natural Connections (1hr | 10-11:00am)

Energy is all around us. Learn how energy travels throughout an ecosystem and how we fit into the flow.

The Good, Bad, and Ugly (1hr 30min | 10-11:30am)

Let's talk all about Marshy Point's wild inhabitants: the beneficial species, the pests, and the ones with bad reps.

Woodlands to Wetlands (2hr | 10am-12n)

Explore wildlife's water's-edge interactions during a guided hike through neighboring habitats. Wade the shallows to find and learn about amphibians, fish, and insects.

Spring & Summer Programs (Available April 15-August 15)

Canoe Exploration (2hr | 10am-12n)

Navigate the tidal creek with an ACA certified canoe guide to experience the creek's boundless communities and wondrous natural landscapes. Ages 8+; limit 22 total participants.

Gateway to the Bay (2hr | 10am-12n)

See what being a "productive wetland" means by getting in it! Learn about the Chesapeake Bay and its watershed.

Incredible Invertebrates (1hr | 10-11:00am)

Around 10 quintillion insects live on Earth right this second. Learn what makes them vital to ecosystems and study them in their natural habitats.

Reptiles & Amphibians (2hr | 10am-12n)

Herpetology is the study of reptiles and amphibians. Get muddy as we hike to their habitats and observe their world.

3. All participants and their teachers/leaders/chaperones must dress for the weather and be prepared to get wet and muddy; do not wear open-toed shoes. Your group must stay together for the program's entirety unless otherwise directed by a naturalist.
